Important questions if you're curious about grad school

Is now the time for graduate school?

- List your top reasons for wanting to continue your education
 - For example: career growth, higher earnings, research and teaching opportunities
 - Use the 5 Whys to explore your deeper motivations and goals
- A common mistake is to go to grad school as a fallback if you don't have a job
 - Understand the financial investment, including opportunity costs (i.e., income)
 - Feel free to explore jobs and grad programs in parallel, comparing costs and benefits
- Many CS professionals recommend getting your grad degree immediately after undergrad

What do you want to study?

- Explore options by talking to some of your favorite faculty about fields of interest
- Research online and network to learn about Master's vs. Doctoral programs
- Envision yourself in 5-10 years to anticipate how different areas of focus could help you reach long-term goals

How do you decide where to apply?

- Identify prospective programs to add to your list using online resources
- Thoroughly research the school, department, program and faculty (don't forget to inquire about financial aid)
- Consider opportunities to connect directly with representatives from each program
- Prioritize your list and remember to apply to several options (6-10 recommended)

How does the application process work?

- Know the timeline for submission of materials and try to get everything in early (pg. 14-15)
- Prepare your letters of recommendation and write your personal statement (pg. 18-19)
- Take the GRE or other required assessments and have scores sent directly to schools
